Soccer is a game played with a round ball. Only the goalkeeper can use his or her hands—except when the ball is thrown from off the field. All the other players kick with their feet or let the ball bounce off their heads.



Soccer started in England many years ago. The game was played in towns—the ball was kicked along the streets. As many as a hundred players were on each side. It was possible for the goals to be a kilometre apart.

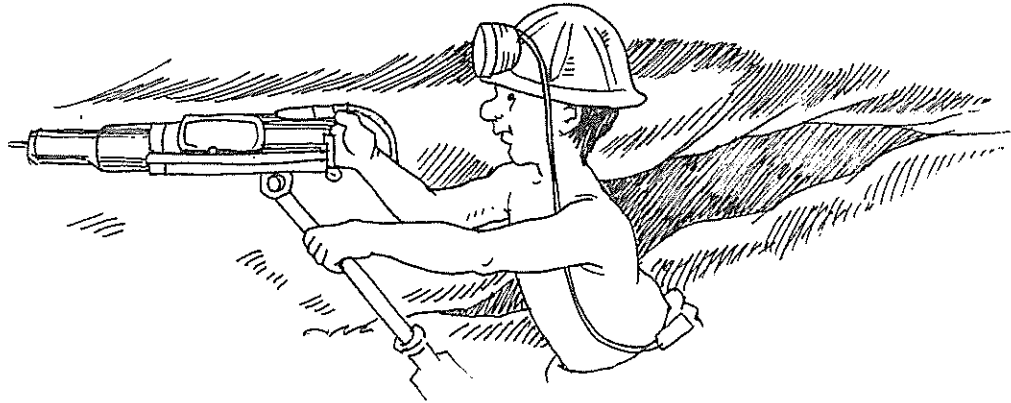

## COAL



Before men and women lived on Earth, there were many forests. As the trees died, they were slowly covered by sand and mud. Year by year, the dead trees were pressed flat under the ground. After millions of years, the dead trees became black or brown. They had turned into a kind of rock we call coal.

Today we need coal. Miners go down under the ground to dig for it. They wear lamps on their heads to see in the dark. The coal is moved up and out of the mine on small railway trolleys or moving belts.

Coal is used for fires where steel is made. It is also used to make electricity. Perhaps you have seen the tall chimneys of the buildings where power for our houses comes from. You must have seen the huge pylons and wires that carry this power to the towns and cities.

Many things, like paint, plastics and nylon are made from coal. Coal will not last forever. One day we will probably have to make electric power from the sun instead of burning coal.
